### Andy Warhol

Join the museum education staff to learn about the life and work of Andy Warhol in conjunction with the special exhibition, *Andy Warhol: A to Z*. We will offer a variety of art making workshops, a guided tour of the exhibition, and curriculum ideas for the classroom. Program units and curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards for visual arts, science and social studies. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

### BIG Culture Lesson: The Arts of Mexico and Central America

The Flint Institute of Arts received a BIG Culture Lesson grant from the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs last year. During the 2004-2005 school year, FIA artist-educators worked with 2nd and 3rd grade classes at Washington Elementary School in Flint to integrate visual arts lessons into the core curriculum. In the following two workshops we share the lessons and materials we developed and what we learned about teaching art and the core disciplines.

### BIG Culture, Part I

Art lessons and curriculum materials are based on the following 5 books: *Family Pictures* and *Magic Windows* by Carmen Lomas Garza, *The Pinata Maker* by George Ancona, *The Woman Who Outshone the Sun* by F. Olivera and A. Martinez, and *My First Book of Proverbs* by R. Gonzalez and A. Ruiz. Participants will have time to try out at least one of the art lessons. Program units and materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards for visual arts,



language arts, science and social studies. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

### BIG Culture, Part II

Art lessons and curriculum materials are based on the following 5 books: *Abuela's Weave* by George Castaneda, *Dream Carver* by Diana Kohn, *Diego* by Jeanette Winter, *Frida* by Jonah Winter, and *Saturday Market* by Patricia Grossman. Curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan standards for visual arts, language arts, science and social studies. Participants will have time to try out at least one of the art lessons. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

### Drawing from Life

Brush up on your drawing skills. This workshop will include a full day of drawing focusing on basic proportions, balance of the human figure, foreshortening and tonal drawing of a clothed figure. A gallery visit and curriculum ideas for teaching figure drawing will be included. Program units and curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards

for visual arts. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

### Learning about Color

Fee: \$50 • .5 SB-CEU

Gain a deeper understanding of various color harmonies and the “when, why and how” to use them. The workshop will explore ways that colors sometimes mysteriously interact with each other. Art making projects include a Picasso inspired portrait that can be taken back to the classroom. Program units and curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards for visual arts, science and social studies. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

### Greek Art

Fee: \$50 • .5 SB-CEU

This workshop will combine a review of Greek architecture and ceramics with some practical curriculum ideas for the classroom. Art lessons will include a sculpted relief of a Greek facade and a “black figure style” ceramic plate. Program units and curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards for visual arts, science and social studies. All levels

of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

## Native American Art

FIA art educators will share historical information and curriculum ideas about Native American art. Areas discussed will be the art of the Moundbuilders of the Midwest and South, Southwest petroglyphs, and the Woodland Indians of the upper midwest. Program units and curriculum materials are aligned with the Michigan curriculum standards for visual arts, science and social studies. Participants will have time for a hands-on activity to try out at least one of the art lessons. All levels of artistic ability are welcome. Workshop fee includes lunch.

**Self-guided visits must be scheduled one month in advance and are available during regular operating hours only.**

### Preschool-Grade 6

One adult chaperone for every 5 students is required.

### Grades 7-12

One adult chaperone for every 10 students is required.

### Chaperone Responsibilities

Chaperones bear full responsibility for the behavior of their students, including the observation of all museum guidelines. A confirmation letter including these guidelines will be sent in advance.

### Advance Notice

Programs are available on a first-come, first-served basis and require a minimum of 4 weeks advance notice. Please do not assume a date is reserved for you until you receive written confirmation from us.

### Fees

Fees for all gallery lessons are covered by the Joy E. Allaun Trust. The fee for ArtFor Programs and Studio Lessons is \$2 per participant. The \$3 fee per student for OnePlus programs covers the entire 3-4 lesson unit.

### Access

The FIA is accessible to the handicapped. Please alert us if your group has special needs.

### Resource Packets

Pre-visit and follow-up materials are sent 4-6 weeks in advance.

### Chaperones

Preschool-Grade 1 groups participating in gallery lessons and ArtFor programs must be accompanied by one chaperone for every 10 students. One chaperone for every 15 students is required for Grades 2-12. Designated chaperones must be over 21 years of age and they must be willing to accept responsibility for monitoring the group's behavior.

To ensure enough time at the FIA for your group and others, please be prompt. To receive a complete program, it is critical that you arrive on time. If you are delayed, please call the Education Department at 810-237-7315.

### Cancellations
